The CLEANair Furnace Rebate Program provides consumers rebates for installations of Ultra-Low NOx High Altitude Furnaces, Ultra-Low NOx Weatherized Furnaces, or replacement of a gas fired furnace with an all-electric heat pump system.

What rebates are eligible?

Rebate Types*	Amount	Total Rebates Available**
Ultra-Low NOx High Altitude Furnaces (Installations occurring at or above 4200 ft.)	\$500	200
Ultra-Low NOx Weatherized Furnaces	\$500	600
Replacement of Gas Furnace with Heat Pump with Air Handler System (up to 5.5 tons) ***	\$1500	2000

*One type of rebate per address allowed

**Total rebates available or until funding is exhausted

***Excludes a dual fuel system which is an electric heat pump system with a gas furnace

Are you eligible for the High Altitude Ultra-Low NOx rebate?

You are eligible to receive a High Altitude Ultra-Low NOx rebate if:

1. The installation site is located at or above 4200 feet of elevation and located in the South Coast AQMD territory (<http://www.aqmd.gov/nav/about/jurisdiction>); and
2. An eligible High Altitude Ultra-Low NOx Furnace was installed (<https://cleanair.conservationrebates.com/docs/Qualifying-High-Altitude-Furnaces-List.pdf>).

Helpful Hint: You can use Google Maps to check elevation. Go to the menu and select terrain. Enter in the address then use the + sign to zoom in. The elevation numbers will appear as you zoom in closer.

Are you eligible for the Weatherized Ultra-Low NOx rebate?

You are eligible to receive a Weatherized Ultra-Low NOx rebate if:

1. An eligible Weatherized Ultra-Low NOx unit was installed (<https://cleanair.conservationrebates.com/docs/Qualifying-Weatherized-Furnaces-List.pdf>); and
2. Your household is located within the South Coast AQMD territory (<http://www.aqmd.gov/nav/about/jurisdiction>).

Are you eligible for the Heat Pump System rebate?

You are eligible to receive a Heat Pump System rebate if:

1. An eligible all-electric, ducted, heat pump split system with air handler was installed (<https://cleanair.conservationrebates.com/docs/Qualifying-Heat-Pump-List.pdf>);
2. You are removing a gas-fired furnace and installing an eligible, all-electric, ducted, heat-pump split system; and

3. Your household is located within the South Coast AQMD (<http://www.aqmd.gov/nav/about/jurisdiction>).

What is needed to file for a rebate?

High Altitude Furnace or Weatherized Ultra-Low NOx Rebate:

1. Detailed Invoice/Customer Contractor verifying the installation location and equipment installed
2. Full Model & Serial Number verification (pictures of unit placard, equipment labels on delivery boxes, or warranty registration details)
3. The customer signed rebate release form (If customer was given an instant rebate at purchase)

All Electric Heat Pump Rebate:

1. Detailed Invoice/Customer Contractor verifying the installation location, removal of gas furnace detailed, and equipment installed
2. Full Model & Serial Number verification for new heat pump and air handler (pictures of unit placard, equipment labels on delivery boxes, or warranty registration details)
3. Full Model & Serial Number verification for replaced furnace
4. The customer signed rebate release form (If customer was given an instant rebate at purchase)

How many rebates can I receive?

Only one type of rebate (High Altitude, Weatherized, or Heat Pump) is eligible per address. If multiple Heat Pumps, High Altitude Furnaces, or Weatherized Units are installed, you may receive the applicable rebate amount for each furnace or unit installed.

How to apply for a rebate?

- Have an eligible installation of a High Altitude Ultra Low-NOx Furnace, a Weatherized Furnace, or replace the existing gas furnace with an all-electric, ducted, heat pump split system
- Go to cleanairfurnacerebate.com and fill out the online rebate application
- Upload supporting information
- Submit the rebate request
